Wedding Music Suggestions

There are a wide number of choices of music available to an engaged couple for their wedding liturgy at St. Mary's. Our director of music ministries will walk you through the process of choosing music. This list provides some titles that may be of interest to you. It is not exhaustive, but hopefully helpful. Also, please refer to our *Music for the Sacrament of Marriage* handout.

Responsorial Psalm Settings

The Responsorial Psalm between the scripture readings is a proclamation of scripture, but one that will be sung! Using the book *United in Christ* provided by the parish, choose first from among the Psalm texts, and then consult with the parish musicians for a musical arrangement/style that you like. Different settings may paraphrase the text differently.

Suggested Psalms include:

Psalm 33 "The earth is full of the goodness of God."

Psalm 34 "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord." or "I will bless the Lord at all times."

Psalm 103 "The Lord is kind and merciful."

Psalm 112 "Blessed the one who greatly delights in God's commands."

Psalm 128 "Blessed are those who fear (love) the Lord." or "See how the Lord blesses those who fear (love) him."

Psalm 145 "God is compassionate toward all his works."

Psalm 148 "Let all praise the name of the Lord."

Familiarity is an important factor when choosing songs for everyone to sing!

Music for the Preparation of the Gifts (within Mass)

The time during Mass when the gifts of bread & wine and gifts for the poor are brought forward is a very short period of time. Instrumental music is very suitable for this part of the liturgy, as are short, appropriate sung pieces.

Many of the pieces noted as instrumental preludes may work here. Many of the suggestions for Psalms and Opening Songs, played instrumentally, are also suitable for this purpose.
