

Holy Communion

Please follow these instructions for approaching the sanctuary and receiving Holy Communion:

- The ushers will signal when each section is to come forward for Communion. The first to be invited to Communion will be the **side sections** beginning with those sitting near the back.
- Please use the **center aisle** to approach the front. (Those in the side sections, please walk back to the vestibule, over to the center, and then walk forward.)
- All will return to their seats by the **side aisles**.
- **Maintain at least six feet** from anyone who is not in your household.
- Keep your **mask** on except for the moment you receive Communion.
- At the marked position six feet from the priest, **PAUSE** and express your reverence for the Eucharist with a bow of your head. When he says, “The Body of Christ!” respond “Amen!” and **then** remove your mask and step forward to receive Communion.
- You are strongly encouraged to receive Communion in the hand to reduce the spread of disease.
- After you consume the Eucharist, place your mask back on (covering your mouth and nose) and **then** turn to go back to your place.
